

Imperial Oil and Standard Oil 1880-1914

- Imperial Oil Ltd. established at Petrolia, Ontario 1880
- Standard Oil Trust established 1882
- Standard Oil acquires 75% of shares of Imperial Oil 1899
- Petrolia refinery closed 1901
- Imperial Oil sales coordinated at 26 Broadway New York City
- Imperial Oil managed by Horace Chamberlain of Standard Oil (NY) 1899-1911
- Standard Oil Trust dissolved by U.S. Supreme Court 1911

The Teagle Era

Walter Teagle
President of Imperial Oil 1914-18
President of Standard Oil (New Jersey) 1918-37
Chairman of the Board of Standard Oil (New Jersey) 1937-42



The Teagle Era at Imperial Oil

- Capitalization increased from \$5.6 million to \$50 million (1915)
- Sarnia refinery expanded
- New refineries at Vancouver, Montreal, Halifax, Regina
- Imperial sales coordinated from Toronto
- Establishment of International Petroleum Company (1914)
- Oil exploration authorized in western Canada (1918)
- Establishment of Tropical Oil Company (1918) later merged with IPC
- Acquisition of Royalite in Turner Valley, Alberta (1920)




IPC oil fields in Peru







